## Clean-up Buckets Needed

Shenandoah's Disaster Response Team has issued an immediate call for congregations to assemble Gift of the Heart Clean-up Buckets in response to the flooding again in the Gulf as well as throughout the mid-west. Local collection points have been arranged throughout the presbytery where COMPLETED buckets can be delivered and will be picked up for delivery to the New Windsor, MD, warehouse. Because the buckets are somewhat bulky, this will allow congregations to concentrate resources on the items for the buckets and not have to pay for shipping to the warehouse.

## Under the Radar

First let me apologize for inadvertently stuffing **Bill Heinemann's** average 50-hours-a-month spent working on MPC's food pantry into a single week, a couple of issues ago. And I'm supposed to be one of the church's proofreaders! Well, things will slip by...

It would be easy to get into the same kind of pickle with this issue's subject, **Kay Davis**. We faithfully see her hither and yon around our church, at no fixed address therein, and we see--many times without realizing she had a shaping hand in it--the results of her work, but we don't see the under-the-radar underpinnings of that work. She confesses that her house is so filled with boxes and piles of papers concerning her MPC tasks that her husband Mark "occasionally sighs." (Probably wisely, I neglected to ask her about her MPC hours-per-week / month.) The arc Kay's life story has traversed is unusual and heartwarming, and it marvelously prepared her for what she does here.

Kay was born and grew up in Whitehall, Wisconsin, a town of 1200 people, where her parents had a florist business. Her mother was a teacher, and her father was teacher of an adult Bible class in their 100-member conservative Baptist church and a member of the school board. Kay herself played the piano and organ in the church and taught Vacation Bible School children's classes. Her father always bought books for his two children at Christmas, which opened up other subjects than religion. (Kay's brother is now a linguist living in California, and he is married to an anthropologist whose specialty is the glue, manufactured from orchids, that Aztecs used to secure feathers to their costumes.) Kay's all-time favorite book was one of these Christmas gifts which helped open her up to the world of nature. She still has it, well-worn now. If you sense hers was a family where learning was highly valued, you're right.

Kay went off to Northwestern College in Minneapolis in 1956. During one summer she and another girl went "all over Wisconsin" leading Vacation Bible Schools, where she learned she loved to teach. In her junior year she met Mark, who was a young faculty member, six years her senior. She managed to read all the books on his list for an English class even though she wasn't taking it. She worked in the library and they saw a lot of each other there. She was editor of the school newspaper and Mark was the faculty advisor. "He managed to keep my radical self in bounds." Uncertain whether she could support

herself with a major in Christian education, she had switched to elementary education, and after graduating she taught at Anoka, a Minneapolis suburb, for three years. She and Mark broke up, but kept in touch. "I hired myself out to the Department of Defense to teach elementary education [to military families] in Japan for a year, and I wrote Mark to tell him I was considering whether to teach another year in Japan or in Libya." Mark proposed marriage by overseas mail, and she answered yes the same way. They were married in November 1964.

Because Mark was in the higher education business, Kay was now in a position to take advantage of the general custom of free tuition for faculty spouses, which she did—big time. She started out in graduate school and earned a master's degree in curriculum and instruction. Meanwhile she was hired--sight unseen!--for a school position in St. Louis Park, another suburb of Minneapolis. After two years the Davis family moved to Maryville College in Tennessee. Tennessee's education rules meant she was not certified to teach there without additional courses, so she decided to just take any classes she wanted. It was like getting the whole candy store at once. Exasperated by the incompetence of the teacher of an art history 101 class she was taking, she made sure her fellow students could at least get the core of what the subject had to offer by shaping good questions that opened up the subject, and then in the ensuing discussions answering them herself! Talk about operating under the radar (at least as far as the instructor was concerned)!

After two years the Davises moved back to Minneapolis where Mark was on the faculty at Augsburg College, for ten years, and where their second son was born. Kay took more art classes at the University of Minnesota and earned a license in pre-school education. In 1978 Mark was offered a job as dean at Atlantic Christian College (now Barton College) in Wilson, NC, which position he occupied until his retirement in 1997, when the family moved here. Kay became interested in another facet of education: that of gifted children, "since we had one." She got a license in that field. Then in order to get resources for gifted children in Wilson County schools, she needed to become a principal. So she acquired an "administrative degree" as an "educational specialist." (This is an "all-but-dissertation doctorate.") She also found out she liked teaching adults. She taught continuing education courses for Wilson County teachers and was an assistant principal in a middle

school and principal of a primary school (pre-school to 2nd grade plus special education). So she was a natural, when they moved here, to be involved with JMU in the supervision and evaluation of student teachers.

Looking back over this (astonishing to me) career track, Kay says she has acquired just about enough credit hours to have gone to college twice. She has taught at every age level from pre-school to post graduate, except for high school. And all this without having a doctorate to show for it! If there's any justice in the world, some institution ought to award her an honorary doctorate for all that work, and the way she has so successfully brought her stream of newly acquired knowledge to bear. For example, she has had ten years of writing curriculum for gifted children.

As the Davises moved from place to place they kept active in churches. Each one was more open in its thinking than their previous one. MPC has been a particularly good fit for them. In Wilson Mark was asked to be a lay preacher at little Bethany Presbyterian Church out in the country, with about 35 people (including 2 children) in it. Kay was soon playing the piano for worship, telling the children's stories, and rejuvenating the Sunday School—herself and these two sharp little boys. In Wilson and since, she and Mark have led a number of youth trips to Central America and the Caribbean. They served as volunteers in mission for six months in Nicaragua also.

After moving here Kay found teaching opportunities at MPC: two years of Disciples classes co-taught with Mark, small groups, Circle Bible Studies. She served a term as an elder, working on the evangelism committee. She is also active in the Windcatchers group.

If you want to think about how God works in a life to prepare a person to fit in a particular position, replay this scene in your mind: Diann Reed walks up to Kay during the early development of Faith Village a few years ago and says "Would you write curriculum for one of our classes, every six weeks?" Then, a little later, the question is "Would you edit the whole curriculum we're developing?" There's a Biblical text for this, in Esther 4:14: "And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"

One of the nicest things about Kay is that she wears all this learning, all these skills, so lightly. Two little children are very fortunate to have a grandmother like that. Musing on successful education, Kay said, "If children understand why they're learning, that's wonderful. Kids' brains have pegs that knowledge needs to be hung on." Teach on, Kay. We're glad you're in our midst. Our ears are open.
