Giving to the Church

It's the part of the stewardship program we usually don't like to hear about: giving our money to the church.

Giving can be hard to hear about because we often find it difficult to think about why we give. Sometimes we may feel we have to give because we're supposed to, it's our duty or responsibility. Other times we may give because we feel guilty or obligated. None of those motivations do much to inspire the joy of giving or the joy of hearing someone ask us to give.

But giving can be a joy. When we focus, not on what we are giving, but on the giver and the gifts God brings into our lives, we can respond in joy.

The little boy in the story about Jesus feeding the 5,000 willingly gave his lunch for others. And as he gave joyfully, Jesus used what he gave to do miracles.

God does the same today. That which is given in joy gives joy. And that which is given in joy can be multiplied to reach many.

That's the story we have to tell about the gifts we have to share.

Then it might be said of us as Paul said of the believers in Corinth: "They gave themselves first to the Lord" (2 Corinthians 8:5).

In worship on November 9th, you will have the opportunity to make a cheerful sacrifice in response to God's grace in your life. The dollars you invest in the mission of Christ's church will not be wasted. Let's give our best to God through the ministry of this congregation this year.

Sent To Serve -Mission Worker visits MPC

Sunday, November 23rd - Morning Worship
Lunch and Program to follow (childcare provided)

Each Sunday we are sent out from the baptismal font to 'go and do' as God calls each of us to serve. Sometimes that means being faithful as students in a classroom; sometimes it's working in a food pantry; sometimes it's visiting and praying with a sick friend or family member. And sometimes the places to which God sends are so sensitive, names can't even be put in print!

Such is the case with a newly commissioned mission worker from right here in the valley. God has called this gifted woman of deep faith to teach other women in poor and isolated parts of Central Asia basic life and business skills. The Deacons of MPC heard her speak last spring and were moved by her sense of call to 'go and do'. We have joined other churches and individuals in the area in an effort to send her out to serve as she has so strongly felt God's call. On November 23 we will have a chance to get to know her more fully as a congregation. She will preach during our worship service and join us for a dish-to-share lunch. After lunch everyone is invited to a full presentation of the work to which she has been called. Over the next couple weeks a display with her name, photo and details of her upcoming ministry will be present in the Narthex before and after worship. Please take the opportunity to learn more prior to her time with us!

Faith Village

Rules, rules, rules! They are everywhere...at home, at school, at church and even at play. Under the Radar

Jean Cake was born and grew up in Hilton Village, which is now a part of Newport News, VA. It was the nation's first government-built planned community, begun in 1918 for Newport News shipbuilding workers and community professionals. Her father was an engineer who worked in the shipyard. A Presbyterian Church was next door to her house; her school was across the street, and beyond it were the James River and the Hilton Pier. [There is a text for this, proven true for so many of us: Psalm 16:6, "The lines have fallen for me in pleasant places."] Sunday School, of course, was just a hop, skip, and a jump away. But World War II and her high school years coincided, and the world became a more dangerous place during her youth.

Jean went off to Farmville State Teachers College (now Longwood University) and graduated with a BS in Business Education and Spanish. Her most valuable experiences came from extra-curricular activities and leadership responsibilities: Dramatic Club, writing for the school newspaper and magazine, and sorority relationships. She "woke up to religion" during college, especially helped by the Rev. Phil Roberts, who was pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Farmville.

Back home, Dr. Paul Buckles, pastor of Newport News' First Presbyterian Church, asked her to accept a position as his secretary. (That is the church from which we purchased our MPC organ. It was built for that church in 1949-50.) Jean was uncertain about being adequately prepared for various aspects of the work—such as when Dr. Buckles asked her to go to Massanetta Springs as a counselor for their church's youth attending a summer conference. She says it was an education working for such an encouraging boss; he had confidence she could do anything, and she found out she could do it.

Enter Dick Forbes, stage right..."We met because Lucy Jean Sorensen had appendicitis." Lucy was the lifeguard at the country club pool and Dick filled in for her the last half of the season. Dick had moved with his family from Culpeper to Newport News before his senior year in high school and had then gone to what is now Old Dominion University in Norfolk for two years. In 1952 he finished college at William and Mary with a degree in business administration and personnel work. They married at Christmas 1951, and the organ at First Presbyterian Church thundered merrily to send them on their way.

Dick had joined the Naval Reserve at age 18, but somehow his papers were lost and when the draft was within a day of snagging him for the army during the Korean War, he went to Washington to check on his status,

his papers were straightened out, and he went on active duty as a navy seaman. He applied to Officer Candidate's School and was accepted, and after discharge remained in the Reserve for many years. After his active duty ended, he worked for Montgomery Ward in its training department for 3 years. This involved much moving around—Norfolk, Hagerstown, Suffolk, Baltimore—but when he was about to be assigned to New York City, where neither he nor Jean wanted to go, conveniently a job offer in the personnel department came from the Newport News Shipyard, and they rejoiced to go back home. They bought a house and settled in; three children now graced their home, and the family was active in the First Presbyterian Church of Newport News. Eight years went by and then Dick answered the call that had been building in his life toward the ministry. He attended Union-PSCE in Richmond. Jean found a job in the seminary library that further expanded her life skills.

Now Jean was a minister's wife, something she hadn't expected from life. Dick's three pastorates were 5 years at Campbell Memorial Presbyterian Church in Weems on the Northern Neck; 7 years at Faith Presbyterian Church in Newport News, a rather young church; and nearly 12 years in Tuscarora Presbyterian Church in Martinsburg, WV. In Weems Jean went back to work as a teacher of first grade, and continued teaching in Newport News, "enjoying doing things I never thought I could." In Martinsburg she scaled back to being a substitute teacher. It was there that "a whole new life opened up" to her in ecumenical relations and mission work as she became involved with Shenandoah Presbytery committees. She had to learn how to drive a van to take Presbytery youth to Montreat for mission conferences. These conferences were life-changing for some of her Tuscarora young people. She scheduled missionary itineration across the Presbytery and saw that missionaries were well treated and well supported while they were here. She went to Haiti for 2 weeks with a group from Windy Cove church.

When Dick retired they moved to Massanutten Village in 1992 (and to Sunnyside in 2002). John and Carol Lown were old friends, and after scoping out churches in the area they settled happily at MPC. Jean became a charter member of the Crossroads Pealers handbell choir. She says, "I especially love the bell choir because it's the only way I can make music—singing is not my long suit." She taught in VBS for several years, took part in a circle, and served as a leader in Presbyterian Women in various capacities. She was a member of the Session's Witness and Service Committee by virtue of her position as Mission Ministry Abroad chairperson in PW. She happily recalls that committee, after study, recommending various

Global Food Crisis - An Invitation to Respond



More than 800 million people in the world go hungry. 800 million hungry people—that's a number that's hard to get our minds around in this 'super-sized' meal world.

Our congregation has helped feed some of those 800 million hungry people in significant ways, including our monthly 4-Cents-a-Meal Hunger Offering, the ministry of our Food Pantry, our support of the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, and by our recent participation in the area CROP Walk. We have now been invited to respond in a different way.

The leaders of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church(USA) have invited us to join other Presbyterians in responding to the global food crisis by entering a period of prayer and fasting. Specifically, we have been invited to keep a fast one weekend each month between now and October 2009. Several members from

our community of faith have already accepted this invitation, and you have the chance to join them.

Here's how it will work at Massanutten. The third weekend of the next twelve months, participants will observe a 36 hour fast from Friday evening through Sunday morning. Each month the church will provide you with materials that will open your eyes to an area of the world being affected by the global food crisis, as well as with some spiritual resources through which God will fill you as you fast. We will break the fast together on each third Sunday morning at 8:15 a.m. with communion and a light breakfast. Child care will be provided.

You are invited to join us every month, one time, or as you are able. This year-long opportunity will end on World Food Day, October 16, 2009. 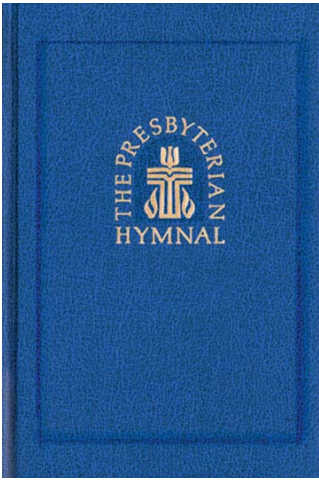
advances in MPC mission work to the Session: starting the MPC Food Pantry, buying out the previous Pre-School organizer, and starting the program to provide cars so needy people could get to work. In recent years she has taken four different weekday Disciple classes and is a faithful member of the Disciples Sunday School class.

One year she was sick with pneumonia and had surgery and remembers how the congregation was marvelously helpful. This was the same year the organ from First Church Newport News (which was closing) was installed here, a special joy to have it come home again to Jean and Dick in a final intersection, after being a part of their lives on so many occasions. She especially appreciates our worship services and the way its parts are so well integrated.

Jean finds ways to be in ministry at Sunnyside. A quiet and reflective person, she looks at the arc of her life and says, "My life doesn't seem to be goal oriented. It's more like seeing unexpected opportunities and being led to accepting the challenge." The result of seizing those opportunities is a life with a wide variety of skills, greatly useful in the church and out of it. Thanks, Jean, for all you do for the Kingdom of God, and for leading the way into deeper mission.
