## *Nancy Ruh*

The Educator Nominating Committee (ENC) is ecstatic to share Mrs. Nancy Ruh, has accepted a call from the Session to become MPC's fulltime Director of Christian Education. Please join us in welcoming Nancy and her family for her commissioning during worship Sunday, February 3.

When the ENC first began meeting in the summer of 2006, we worked diligently to assess our educational needs and accurately describe the diverse make-up of our congregation in order to identify the characteristics needed in an educator. The search was temporarily suspended while our staffing needs were identified and the Live into Hope Campaign was conducted. Kudos go out to all church members for providing the resources we need to better accomplish the work God has called us to do. The ENC was able to reconvene in the fall of 2007, and it soon became evident we had found our DCE match in Nancy.

Growing up in Burlington, North Carolina, Nancy and her three siblings were raised by parents with a deep Christian faith in a traditional southern Presbyterian church. Her parents still reside in Burlington but are in the midst of dealing with some life changes. Her mother is suffering from Alzheimer's Disease and broke her hip in the autumn of 2007. It became too difficult for Nancy's father to care for his wife at home, and a few weeks ago the family moved their mother into a residential Alzheimer's facility.

Having always had a passion for caring for others, Nancy earned a degree in Respiratory Therapy from Elon University. She spent several years working at hospitals in Woodbridge and Fredericksburg, Virginia and is a licensed yoga instructor.

In 1982, Nancy married Ken Ruh. Ken was raised in Wisconsin and began his career in the Air Force. (Please be extra kind to him as he deals with the Green Bay Packers failed attempt to make it to the Super Bowl.) He retired early from the Foreign Services and this fall retired for a second time from a contract company which kept him busy continuing his work with the State Department. Ken loves to be outdoors and is thrilled to be moving from Northern Virginia to the mountains in the Shenandoah Valley.

## Under the Radar

Patti Hobbie's life has certainly been intertwined with Massanutten Presbyterian Church since she joined in 1997. Anyone present at that Lenten dinner in March 1999 will never forget Bo Hobbie taking the mic and announcing to the congregation he just proposed to Patti, and she said "Yes!" Remember the cheering, the applause, which led to the happy marriage blending two families, solidly rooted in MPC! That marriage was begun in August with their act of generosity which said "No wedding presents, thank you; we bring enough to this marriage from our own two homes! Instead please make a donation to Habitat for Humanity as you come to our reception!" Thus a handsome sum was raised for the worthy charity.

Patti is a woman of great energy. In her earliest years at MPC she helped out in the nursery, where her youngest son was one of the children. Later she took over the library and supervised its transfer from the anteroom, off the back of the former sanctuary into the new room, and the welcoming way it looks today is a result of her care. John McDonald, our minister of education then, asked her to reorganize the Logos program and she has been involved in Logos and WOW ever since; currently she co-chairs WOW with Wendy Stapleton. As if that wasn't enough, our former Parish Nurse, Judy Williams, asked Patti to take over coordinating the blood drives when she retired. Patti was a natural for this. As concierge (30 hours/week) at Massanutten Resort, she ran blood drives for 10 years. After 3 years she and Jeannie Sutherland passed this task on to Shawn and Linda Green, but Patti's bean dip she

prepared to serve donors has become the stuff of legend. Also at the Resort, she has a food bin collecting for our pantry. People bring more food than they eat to the timeshares and usually don't want to take it home so they use the bin, and Bill Heinemann collects it once a week. Another "under the radar" piece: she keeps the ladies' rest rooms at MPC supplied with sweet smelling soaps. Just the kind of thing a concierge would think of!

One of Patti's current jobs is serving as the church's representative at weddings and other special functions in the building. She is able to take much of the burden of details from our pastors. It has been a great pleasure to her to be involved with church families whose sons or daughters are being wed. She has done this for two years. Another piece of the action that has brought her joy was organizing and cooking, two spaghetti dinners for the Youth Auctions in '05 and '06. She also served as a mentor to Taylor Frazier in last year's confirmation process. And the *4 Cents A Meal Offerings* on first Sundays? Patti organizes the children for that.

You will have noticed a heavy emphasis on youth running through the above; natural enough for a church family that has 3 sons. Of them, Patti says one of her church jobs is "making sure the sound man gets to church on Sunday mornings."

Patti appreciates the way her work at the church engages and informs her daily prayer life. Her prime learning from her MPC experience is "to be flexible, to be happy to worship God whatever you're doing." She hopes in the future to get into more Bible study as her circumstances permit. Her intelligence and dedication combined with her vigor is a great asset to MPC. Patti, you bring us varied blessings; and we bless you in return.
