## Goodbye Kenya, Hello Sudan

We are privileged to share more from Kelly Miller on her mission experience. As you are aware, Kelly is working with African Inland Missions and has been in Africa since October 2007. She continues to post updates on her blog and we are excited to share her recent comments.



February 2008 - As The second half of African Based Orientation went quickly by. . . At the end of the last full week at ABO we had a fun night and a celebration dinner. The fun night was just a bunch of skits, jokes, dances, songs and trivia games. The kids sang some songs they had learned and a few of the girls put on a puppet show. There was a challenge between the kids and the parents about who knew more about Africa. The kids won. . . Our skit, though, was hilarious. Meghan, Rachel (12), and I were the six-legged elephant named Gertrude.

The night ended with ice cream, cookies and brownies (Yes, I am in Africa, but I don't get to eat these things all the time!). Now, onto the celebration dinner and, oh my, what a dinner it was! I've never seen so much meat in my life! I think the men were getting pretty desperate for iron and protein and, as a result, dinner was a meat fest. I'm not kidding. It was meat for the main course with a side of more meat! We had steak (fillet mignon w/bacon wrapped around it), chicken, pork tenderloin, hot dogs (that tasted like American hot dogs) and all in a large abundance! We also had some sautéed onions, grilled pineapple, fried potatoes, cheese, fruit salad and, to top it off, ice cream. I don't think I've eaten so much

meat in my life! Everything was grilled outside and it was amazing.

On February 5, we said our goodbyes to everyone and headed up to Nairobi . . . The next day was the big shopping day. After breakfast at Java House, we bought a few African crafts . . . After shopping a bit we saw a movie...this was our third movie in Africa! Thursday morning we flew from Nairobi to Loki. We were only in Loki for the day so as soon as we dropped our stuff we went into town to run some errands. . . We literally spent the entire day running around and getting things organized for our flight out to Sudan the next day . . .

I finally arrived back in Torit early Friday morning (February 8) and, after a little recuperation, spent some time in town and at the AIC church. My, how much has changed! The little town I left in December has grown quite a bit in my absence. Although the town itself has changed, the people themselves have not. I was greeted by the same friendly faces I left two months prior. The greetings this time were "Happy New Year" and "You have been lost!"; appropriate greetings for the beginning of a new year and for one returning after some time. As I continue to reacquaint myself with the town and my ministries, I will share with you more. I thoroughly enjoyed my time in Kenya. It is such a beautiful country and I would love to explore it more in the future. But for now, I am excited to be back in Torit. Welcome back to Sudan!

Several of our male church members are on a team in the Valley Mennonite Church League. They have three scheduled games remaining in Round 1. The dates and times of upcoming games are below.

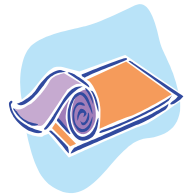

## Under the Radar

For a picture of consistent joy in Christ's service at MPC across many years, look no further than **Betty Long**. Betty and her husband Bud joined MPC over 50 years ago—in 1956, when Paul Shiflett was MPC's pastor. Betty was trained as a nurse at Rockingham Memorial Hospital and worked in the operating room, and for the last 20 years of her employment she shared a full-time position in Dr. Beasley's office with another nurse, retiring in 1991. That gave her time to raise her family and help at church. At MPC she taught Sunday School, joined a circle, was secretary of the Presbyterian Women, and directed Vacation Bible School early on. She and Bud were youth advisors for 8 years and began the annual Easter breakfast and Christmas Eve programs with the youth. In the course of Dr. Arnold Poole's pastorate, responding to a need for increased fellowship among church members, they started the Prime Timers, which grew into two organizations divided by age: the over-fifties (Prime Timers) and the under-fifties (3Ms), which in the early 1990s were still presenting often hilarious programs for each other. The Longs shepherded the Prime Timers until Sam Hayter took over its leadership. A highlight of this group's year every fall is meeting at

the Long's pleasant camp up in Page County for a getaway and picnic.

Betty served on the building committee which planned MPC's initial brick building. She served for five years as an elder in the '80s, and was a member of the Pulpit Nominating Committee that found John Lown—and, some years later, the one that brought us John Leggett. Her service did not neglect mission outside MPC's walls; she and Anna Jean Armstrong started MPC's contribution to the Friendship House meal at Blessed Sacrament R.C. Church, and Betty has been organizing it twice a year for many years now. She is also in mission at Sunnyside (where she and Bud will be moving in a few months), serving as a regional Board member for the last five years, volunteering in transport and feeding. She is the treasurer of the RMH Alumnae Association, which every year honors a graduate with over 30 years' nursing experience—and guess who organizes the banquet year after year? She completed the entire Bethel Series when the church was using it. And she sang soprano in the church choir for 20 years.

In more recent times Betty shows up when Karen Leecy needs some temporary office help, and one suspects that has been going on for a long time. She plays handbells in the Crossroad Pealers, served as table parents with Bud at WOW last year, and as assistants this year. When a need pops up, Betty is ready

to give leadership. She instigated the Emergency Meals and the Bereavement Meals programs. During John Lown's pastorate the church had been having a number of cedar trees decorated at Christmas season. Betty and Bud felt that one single large permanent tree would be a better showpiece for the Chrismons, but an artificial tree of that size cost \$500. So they raised the money to do it; even the church's softball team contributed \$100 to it. And that tree is still in use every Advent in our new sanctuary, glowing with Chrismons.

Betty tells all this to her interviewer in simple, matter-of-fact tones, disclaiming any special credit for a record which involves so much investment of herself for over 50+ years. She confesses that it was formerly said of her that she was at the church five out of every seven days. Though her work load has slowed some with advancing years, she does say working in MPC has been and is very satisfying. "It's the nurse in me; I need to be doing something to help. And the church is very dear to my heart." What stands out here is the lasting quality of so much where she has led the way. The Psalmist (90:17, RSV) cries to God, somewhat plaintively, "establish thou the work of our hands upon us." Betty is deservedly blessed; she can look back and see it living on.
