*“God’s various gifts are handed out everywhere; but they all originate in God’s Spirit. God’s various ministries are carried out everywhere; but they all originate in God’s Spirit. God’s various expressions of power are in action everywhere; but God himself is behind it all. Each person is given something to do that shows who God is: Everyone gets in on it, everyone benefits. All kinds of things are handed out by the Spirit, and to all kinds of people! The variety is wonderful...I want you to think about how all this makes you more significant, not less. A body is...all the different-but-similar parts arranged and functioning together...You are Christ’s body— that’s who you are! You must never forget this. Only as you accept your part of that body does your ‘part’ mean anything...”*  
~ excerpts from 1 Corinthians 12:4-31, The Message

Though the translation of these verses from 1 Corinthians may be different, this passage is familiar to many of us. We often hear it and our thoughts go immediately to using our gifts for activities such as teaching Sunday school, singing in the choir, serving on Session, even preaching a sermon. This version reminds us that we are all gifted, and that giftedness originates in God’s Spirit. It includes an important word for us as we consider our giftedness—*everywhere*.

As we ponder the meaning of giftedness, we acknowledge that our spiritual gifts are given for the common good—the building up of God’s kingdom here on earth. That certainly includes our participation in the life of the church. But it also reaches into our lives outside the church—in our homes, our places of work, and our local and global communities.

Join us for our 5th Sunday Forum, Sunday, March 30 at 9:00 a.m., as together we explore what it means to be gifted, how we discern our own variety of gifts, and what purpose there might be for using our giftedness in all areas of life. ## Under the Radar

In this age when people switch religious denominations and hardly give it a thought, **Betty Chalfant's** life story evidences the opposite: where all the institutions of the Church have worked together to produce a solid Presbyterian laywoman steeped in service.

Betty's grandparents were members at New Providence Presbyterian Church in Brownsburg; her father told her of going to church there barefoot as a boy. As an adult, he farmed and was an elder at Hebron Presbyterian Church near Swoope. Betty grew up just across the street from Hebron Church. She remembers teaching the kindergarten class at Vacation Bible School with her younger sister when both were only teenagers. Her earliest memory of Massanetta Springs is from age 5: she was walking on the boards around the spring and her mother grabbed her arm and pulled her back when she got too close to the edge. She was a Pioneer camper and a senior high camper. She came to Madison College and attended First Presbyterian Church in Harrisonburg, and after graduating went to Front Royal where she taught in the school system for 5 years—and also took on the second grade Sunday School class at the Presbyterian church there. She sang in the choir next to Tom Biggs' mother, and knew not only young Tom but also Jim Payne, who would later be her pastor. She moved to Baltimore and lived there ten years, taking part in the young adult group at Brown Memorial Presbyterian Church. During that time she met and married Dan. They moved to Staunton, and attended Hebron again. Later they moved to Charlottesville where they joined Meadows Presbyterian Church and were there for 28 years. The Rev. Jim Payne was minister (and later the Rev. Charlie Talley, and still later the Rev. Jack Heintzleman). Betty organized and supervised a pre-school in that church and worked at the UVA hospital as a bookkeeper to earn tuition

money for her children's college expenses.

In their early days at Meadows the congregation met in a bowling alley, and its members were known as the "Holy Bowlers." Betty served as an elder, was active in Presbyterian Women and was a circle leader. She and Dan sang in the choir. She also started the library at that church and embroidered a full set of paraments in the various liturgical colors to hang on the pulpit (they are still in use, some decades later). In 1972 Charlie Talley had become the executive director of Massanetta Springs and Dan had extra vacation time he was about to lose if he didn't use it, so he asked Charlie, "What can I do to help?" Within a day the answer came back: "Come help us and we'll give you a cottage while you're here." That summer the family was there for two 3-week periods, with Dan doing carpentry work and Betty helping in various ways. Their children were old enough that they could "turn the kids loose" on the grounds and soon the kids were helping as volunteers also. In 1991 Dan retired and they bought a summer house in the Massanetta Springs Community which they winterized, had upgraded, and moved into.

Betty served the larger church as a member of the Camps and Conference committees of both the Presbytery of the Peaks and Shenandoah Presbytery and as a delegate to Synod. She was also often a commissioner to Presbytery.

Early in 1992 the Chalfants joined MPC and sang in the choir "until our voices gave out." Betty is currently active in a circle and Presbyterian Women. She has used her needlework skills to make two lovely banners for the church; one shows the seal of the Presbyterian Church, US (our predecessor denomination) in cross stitch, and another banner for Presbyterian Women.

Recently the Chalfants moved into the Sunnyside community and Betty continues to set up and supervise the preparation of bulk mailings at Massanetta Springs as she has done for years. This process occurs six times a

year at Massanetta Springs and a single mailing can be to as many as 10,000 addresses. (She also does this at MPC; the biweekly document you are reading from right now went through her system with hundreds just like it.) You can also see her from time to time at the front desk serving a 4-hour volunteer stint, often on a Friday evening when there is need of someone particularly well acquainted with the Conference Center to answer questions and give directions. The Chalfants also take this duty one Sunday morning a month. They have never been paid for their service to Massanetta Springs, except for the meals they're given.

Several years ago, Betty volunteered to replace the decayed curtain treatments in the dining hall at Massanetta Springs. Once new curtains had been sewn and erected, the spaces between the windows obviously needed an upgrade, so Betty got busy with her cross-stitching and using among other things some templates from P. Buckley Moss, she made ten beautiful cross-stitches. That artist was so pleased with the treatments of her work, she autographed them! Now they adorn the dining room walls. Some of Betty's work is also found in the relatively new Greenwood Lodge. Betty is also a proficient maker of Chrismons, and has led many workshops on the subject.

One of the Chalfant's children went to Union-PSCE in Richmond. Their daughter Barbara is now the Director of Christian Education at Silver Spring Presbyterian Church in Mechanicsburg in central Pennsylvania.

Betty has helped the church's institutions work across many years. "I've loved being in the choir," she says, and "I hope others get as much pleasure out of looking at my cross-stitching as I did in making it....I can't imagine doing anything else" [than investing my time and energy in the church]. We're glad you couldn't "imagine anything else," Betty. Would that the institutions of the church would work for our youth as they did for you! Thank you for your loyalty.
