One of the joys of being a part of the Small Group Ministry of the Massanutten congregation is the development of relationships within the group and getting to know the congregation with whom we worship. As our church continues to grow it becomes more important that we create opportunities for fellowship with one another. Keeping this in mind the Adult Education Ministry is delighted to announce the following groups starting up or continuing in the fall in an attempt to meet a variety of interests.

Small Groups for the Fall

- **Study of C. S. Lewis' book The Screwtape Letters** - This group will meet once a month at MPC and is led by Linda Knupp.
- **Short term study of Jack Haberer's book Godviews** - This is a six week study led by Pat Armstrong. There will be an open discussion on the book and a time to share praises and concerns with one another.
- **"Windcatchers: Awareness, Advocacy, Action"** - This group attempts to be sensitive to God's Spirit in identifying issues that we tend to overlook, but that have a negative impact, especially on the powerless/disadvantaged/overlooked segments of our society. We plan to raise awareness of these issue in our church publications, suggesting possible Christian responses. Meeting on an as needed basis (4-6 week intervals).
- **Women's Bible Study and Prayer Group** - Meets twice a month at Sunnyside to make it more convenient for residents there to attend; however, women of all ages are welcome. Wright's guide to Acts is being considered as the fall study. A time to share prayer concerns begins the meetings and leadership of the Bible Study is shared by members of the group.
- **Just for Fun** - Social groups such as "Dinner for Eight", "Singles", "Parents Night Out", etc. would be formed to share fellowship and a meal. This is a great way to share fun, food and even discuss any of those problems we all seem to share. You would set your own schedule. More information will be printed in an upcoming newsletter.

DISCIPLES CLASS TO BEGIN NEW STUDY

Are you interested in knowing what is happening inside us when we sing in church? Do you ever wonder why some of the words of hymns keep changing in new hymnals being published? Why has our denomination, the Presbyterian Church U.S.A., begun work on a new hymnal, even though our present one is only eighteen years old? Though Massanutten Church is blessedly free of music battles, do you ever wonder why in so many churches there are fights today over musical forms or styles, so intense that they have been dubbed "the worship wars"? How do you judge what makes a good hymn?

If any of this piques your interest, you are welcome this fall to explore these and other related questions in the Disciples adult Sunday School class as it studies the book *Praying Twice: The Music and Words of Congregational Song*. The title comes from a sentence attributed to an early theologian of the church, Augustine of Hippo, 354-430 C. E.: "Whoever sings [to God, in worship] prays twice." The book is by Brian Wren, one of the leading lyricists of this golden age of hymn writing in which we are blessed to be living. Now 72, he wrote the lyrics for no less than eleven hymns in our blue hymnal. British by birth and education, he has recently retired from the faculty of our denomination's Columbia Theological Seminary. He is known as one of the leading authorities in the field of church music in the English-speaking world, and a lucid writer.

The class begins on September 7th at 9 a.m. in the former church parlor. Its co-teachers are Mark Davis and John Irvine. If you attend, it would be useful to have a copy of the book; you can go to www.amazon.com and elsewhere on the Web to find sources for buying the book at reduced prices, and order your own copy. You need not be trained in music as a prerequisite to taking part. You will understand singing in church at a deeper level by the time you complete the course. You're invited!

Choir practice begins Wednesday, September 3, at 7:00 p.m. Commitments vary from short-term to longer-term, although we will be starting to look at the Christmas music in September. This is the latest addition to our Adult Christian Education Ministry here at Massanutten Presbyterian Church. Sally Young will lead this Sunday School Class beginning September 7 using *The Present Word* as our resource for study.

...a word about this study... The intent of *The Present Word* is to enhance our understanding of scripture as it relates to life experience as well to create a greater awareness of God's self-disclosure, especially God's redeeming love as revealed through Jesus Christ. Throughout this study participants are invited to reflect on how they might live in faith and love. It gives attention to issues such as personal faith, ethics, human relationships, community responsibility, resurrection hope and the implication of Christian discipleship under the Lordship of Christ and in the fellowship of his Spirit.

This fall is a survey of the New Testament, looking at it through the lens of community. We begin by looking at the four gospels and the birth of a new community. We will follow the development and work of this new community in the book of Acts and conclude with the growing pains it experienced through conflict, struggle, and persecution as described in the epistles (letters).

Under the Radar

This issue we focus on David Allen, one of MPC's deacons. David grew up in Bedford County and graduated from Hampden-Sydney College in 1985. As a boy his family did not attend church, but at college he "made the acquaintance of the Presbyterian Church." When he and his wife Dannie moved to this area in 1992 they first attended Elkton Presbyterian Church. In 2001 they moved into Harrisonburg. Their son Zachary and daughter Skylar attended MPC's preschool, and they looked for a church closer to their new home and ended up here. "Having children really helped us focus on finding a church," he said. David is employed in the judiciary system as a Probation Officer for the U. S. District Court.

David is one of MPC's four head ushers. On Sundays when he's on that duty, he finds substitutes if needed, makes sure the acolyte is properly equipped, and keeps the ushering component running smoothly. Recently, you could have found him helping his children distribute fliers about MPC to the homes in Crossroads Farm subdivision.

David is one year into his 3-year term as a deacon, and on that board he chairs the Outreach Committee, a task he finds complex, meaningful, and deeply satisfying. When interviewed he was looking forward to an upcoming meeting of the interdenominational CROP Walk planning committee to get ready for that autumn occasion. Other aspects of MPC in mission are also under the oversight of his Outreach Committee: MPC's Food Pantry, the Turkey Feathers and Angel Tree programs, the Blood Drive, and MPC's participation in the interchurch "People Helping People" program. It's also up to his Outreach Committee to educate the congregation concerning the 4 Cents a Meal Offering collected each first Sun-

day of the month, and the exploratory work toward MPC's supporting a mission worker overseas.

David feels especially rewarded by his committee's work with the H.A.R.T.S. program; the acronym stands for "Harrisonburg And Rockingham Thermal Shelter." This runs from before Thanksgiving to late March and involves 15 supporting churches. Essentially this is "a roving homeless shelter" which moves around among various churches in the city that partner together in clusters. The program got off the ground last winter and MPC partnered with Trinity Presbyterian Church and Community Mennonite Church. A paid full-time coordinator is present wherever the shelter is located, and two church members also stay the night with the guests. The program serves 20-25 people, including a hot supper and a take-out breakfast. Our church is too far out of the city for guests to reach so our volunteers will take certain nights, for example when the program moves to Trinity Church. David has found this and his other work with the deacons a most personally rewarding way "to give back to the community and take care of the needy among us." His time investment of three nights a month for Deacons' meetings does not seem burdensome.

A new aspect of the Deacons' work (accounting for one of those nights each month) is their coming together in groups of four for spiritual development. Ann Pettit helped them get this program started and they are continuing on their own. This is another part of David's growing edge.

Here is a person who is serious about "being a doer of the Word, and not a hearer only." As a result of loving energy like his, MPC is a church vibrantly in mission. Praise God for him, and others like him, in our midst!

The Volunteer Farm ~ Woodstock, Virginia

The Volunteer Farm is a program of the World Foundation for Children. Food is planted, cared for and harvested through the growing season here in the Shenandoah Valley. All the food harvested goes to the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, which has some 430 food pantries (including the *Massanutten Food Pantry*), soup kitchens, Kids' Cafes, and similar outlets in 25 counties and nine cities.

The name "Volunteer Farm" reflects well the nature of this program. Everything is done by volunteers – like us! Since the early spring, individuals and groups have been traveling to Woodstock to take part in the mission of the Volunteer Farm. And now, the Outreach Ministry invites you to become involved as well. Several trips to Woodstock will be organized to help during the harvest season. If you are interested in being part of a morning or afternoon 'work team' to the Volunteer Farm, please call the office or speak to an **Outreach Ministry** member (David Allen, Leslie Dutt, Pam French or Linda Myers).
