- New banners for Ordinary Time are now in the sanctuary. There are two periods of Ordinary Time in the church year. The first comes after Epiphany (January 6) and lasts until Ash Wednesday. The traditional liturgical color for this season is green. The second period begins on the Sunday following Pentecost and lasts until the new liturgical year begins on the first Sunday of Advent. The varied colors in our banners remind us that even in the many green hues of ordinary time there are special times, represented by other colors from the Church year—purple, gold, and white. Strong chords and ever lighter colors rising from the bottom of the banners direct our eyes upwards and toward the center of the sanctuary, inviting us to an attitude of worship. The bright red pane in the upper center reminds us of the ever-present gift of God's Holy Spirit among us. The banners were designed by Sherry Matthews and constructed by Sherry, Ka Guinn and Sharon Lam. The banners were made possible by a gift from George and Judith Conn.
