Go, tell it on the mountain That Jesus Christ is born!*

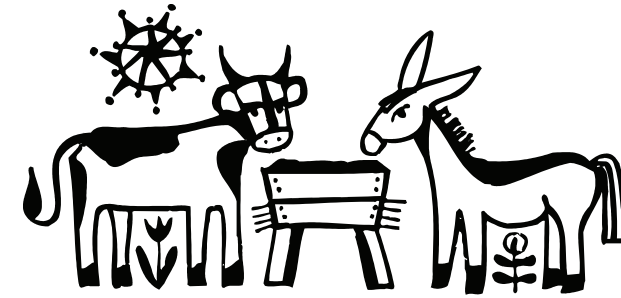
*While shepherds kept their watching O'er silent flocks by night,
